The expectation is that whether land use permissions are granted permanently via a rezoning, or for 3 years via a temporary use permit, the business would still be required to obtain a business license as a separate matter. Rezoning benefits the landowner, not the tenant/business owner. Business licenses are held only by the business owner/tenant and bestow no benefit to the landowner.

involves with insurance.

Good Neighbour Meetings - Penny/Daniel

Regarding OurPlace/900 Block Pandora GNA - June 20:

- My Place on Yates St. is now closed; all residents have been housed. Our Place received letters of thanks from the Victoria School Board and principal of Central Middle School.
- Former CBC building on Pandora has been leased to a company that does fund-raiding and grant writing. Cst. Dan O'Connor talked with them about camping concerns on the property.

Regarding Johnson St. Community (JSC):

- JSC has been on hiatus for several months. There is a meeting on July 12.
- The manager of the facility is proposing a new, smaller meeting format, which would involve reducing attendance to one or two stakeholders per organization. This change would mean that residents of nearby condo buildings could send one or two representatives, possibly on a rotating basis, to each meeting instead of numerous residents coming to every meeting. The same would apply to representatives of the various organizations who regularly attend. Penny is willing to continue as NPNA liaison at these meetings if NPNA still wishes to be represented. There was consensus that NPNA should continue to re represented, with Penny as liaison.

### City of Victoria – Council: Jeremy

- Council has just passed a motion regarding short-term vacation rentals that a room can be rented but not an entire unit.
- Tomorrow Council will discuss a motion about expanding the buffer between cannabis retailers.
- He reports that many tickets have been given to dispensaries, i.e., 9 have been for operating without a license
- Another council motion will be to review rental housing retention and renovictions, and also updating the property maintenance by-law
- For North Park village, both cross walk lights are up, and the banner poles will go up when the Cook St. construction at that area is finished.

## City of Victoria –Staff: Mike

- Mike gave the Association a map with neighbourhood boundaries
- City staff will present their Downtown Public Realm Plan draft to Council at this week's Council meeting
- The City wants to find a way for public to know budgets better to help the general discussion

- City staff said that they will change the parking time soon to two hours on the west side of Cook St. beside the Royal Athletic Park.
- Changing the street parking time from one hour to two hours along the Metropolitan Church was discussed. The city can do this if the adjacent businesses and residents make the request.
