6:35 Substance-

Upcoming, BBQ on the block with aug 31 with QomQem, Solid Indigenous Harm reduction and decolonizing drug checking, available on the website. 2 Research Reports, Not Just Fentanoyl, about synthetic opioids

- Less than 2% of substances not
- Nitazines in pressed pills- an unknown potency, stronger than fentanyl typically, in expected pressed pilled, not expected benzodiazepines.
- Carfentanol has made a comeback, Substance is able to detect with mass spectrometer, if it is in combination with fentanyl
- Solid has given them the side door room, a space that is out of the more confidential space
- Solid put in a proposal to UVIC to have drug checking on campus
- Clicker number has been useful to help people- community mental health team

• **Project Overview**: The Victoria Cannabis Buyers Club (VCBC) has submitted a rezoning application on May 22nd to permit a cannabis retail store that will provide low-cost cannabis for medicinal purposes. The proposal includes a safe on-site consumption lounge with seating for approximately 18 people.

1555 Vancouver Street

- Project Overview: Warmland Cannabis submitted a rezoning application on May 13th to permit an 820 sq. ft. cannabis retail store adjacent to the Save-On-Foods on Pandora Avenue.
 - NPNA would like to make public comment open

930/934 Balmoral Road and 1701 Quadra Street

- Project Overview: The Property Development Council of the United Church of Canada and Aryze Developments are partnering to propose the redevelopment of the site into a new faith, arts, and culture space, along with a six-storey, mixed-use rental building. The proposal includes 129 rental homes—a mix of market and affordable units—and ground-floor commercial space.
 - o CALUC meeting was April 23, we have sent a summary of community feedback

926/930 Pandora Avenue Redevelopment

- **Project Overview:** BC Housing, the City of Victoria, and the Capital Region Housing Corporation (CRHC) are partnering to build 205 new affordable rental and supportive homes at 926/930 Pandora Avenue. The proposed 20-storey building will also feature a large community space with childcare facilities on the ground floor.
 - Got held up because there was a seagulls nest, they need to relocate
 - When the abandoned building went down, rats ended up all over the surrounding streets.
 - The old Girl Guide house has also been abandoned for a while and needs to come down

938 Mason Street (Wellness House)

- **Project Overview:** The ACEH, in collaboration with BC Housing, is developing 30 to 35 studio and two-bedroom units to provide wrap-around services tailored to the Indigenous Street Family. These services will include culturally appropriate social, health, and land-based healing supports to assist individuals on their journey of healing and recovery from substance use.
 - Wasn't a CALUC required because it is a BC housing project
 - But they have been doing lots of community engagement- more so than a regular CALUC
 - For example, garbage and recycling, moved because it was right against someone's backyard, as well as smoking area moved due to resident concerns
 - Residential neighbours on Mason where hoping for a traditional setback, it is more than in the original plans but not as far away from the street as standard



- Mason street will have a major project on both sides of the street for the next 4 years
- CALUC committee, email list gives you an invite to every Land Use Committee meeting, meetings are held whenever there is a new development

Suzanne Anothony, lives right by Vic high,

A play street, came out of a block party. Shutting down the street for freedom of play

- Secured funding for honorarium, themes for the play streets. One theme is a kids maker fair, fun and games, potluck, once a month through the summer except august May, June, July,
- September ends with stone soup and smores.
- Themes around community, fun, food security, bike repair, mending, upcycling, crafting.
- You need a permit to shut down the street, everyone pitches in a little bit, it is very affordable. One loaf of bread can go a long way when everyone is bringing something.

This Sunday afternoon-1-3- Vic High- Camosun street (from Grant to Balmoral)

Neighbourhood small grants have been great for expanding the program renting tents, table.

Pollinator garden, everyone gets outside and digs in the garden

Penny question- Will we get the bulletin board fixed? Cubbins Castle and North Park agreement for advertising local events. Castle dug up all the native plants.

Penny still has the original document- no cooperation from group that owns the property-



Should we move to an outdoor bulletin board model without the glass, keep using it so it is accessible to community members.

We now have four committees associated with the NPNA, they are currently populated by NPNA board and staff but we will be putting calls out to community members, less commitment then joining the board.
