



Safety During Tree Pruning

As part of routine checks, the City of Victoria has identified safety hazards in trees at Central Park. Pruning is required to improve safety conditions prior to high winds and wet weather this fall. Hazards identified include over-extended branches, dead branches, and branches that are not well-attached.

For safety reasons, people and temporary shelters may not be under tree branches while pruning work takes place, as branches can fall and damage property or cause injury. Temporary shelters not under trees but still within 1.5 tree lengths may remain. However, occupants are required to stay out of their shelters while staff prune trees in that area.

Work areas will be secured with markers. For your safety, please remain outside of these areas, which will allow the work to be completed as quickly as possible.



Arborists will work on the highest-priority trees first, beginning in area 1 on the map starting on Monday, Oct. 5, 2020 at 8 a.m.
